Pastor Steele's Message—Encouragement

Many of you have seen those "Pass It On" commercials. They come from a group known as "The Foundation For A Better Life", a non-religious organization. Many billboards display celebrities, others common everyday people. Same goes for the commercials. One such commercial is entitled, "Encouragement!" In fact it was one of the organization's first advertisements.

The ad goes like this: A young married couple comes into a concert hall. Each are coming to their seats in the same row from opposite directions. They meet and say frantically, "Where's Tommy?" The scene immediately shifts to Tommy, the curtains open, and Tommy is sitting in front of the concert grand piano on stage. Of course, the parents are embarrassed. Tommy begins to play "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Stars" on the piano. The camera shot shows the embarrassed parents sliding down into their theater seats. The audience gasps when suddenly, from behind Tommy, comes the concert pianist. He bends down, extends his arms around Tommy, and says, "Don't stop playing!" Tommy continues. The pianist embellishes Tommy's "Twinkle, Twinkle" melody. The duet ends with the parents cheering and a standing ovation from the audience. The commercial ends with the boy's narration: "Encouragement Pass it On!"

Paul writes many letters to the fledgling churches in Asia Minor. The majority of the letters were written to address on going strife in these churches. The letters all start with words of encouragement. Then he addresses the point of disunity. Finally he encourages the members to lay aside their differences and come together. The majority of these churches had members from different social-economic classes.

In Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth, he encourages women to cover their heads. Corinth was a very wealthy city. A woman's societal status was displayed in the braiding of woman's hair. The wealthier you were the more gold strands were braided into the woman's hair. He encourages the woman to cover their hair; so no animosity would rise among the women by the displaying of their braided hair. While in church the women covered their heads, as soon as the woman went back out in public the coverings would come off. In this small act Paul is encouraging unification of the women in this church.

My letter to you this month is a letter of encouragement. Not to long ago, due to COVID, You were not able to gather around Trinity's altar to receive the Body and Blood of Christ; through which you receive forgiveness of sins, strength for your daily

walk, and the reminder of your newness of life in Christ. Communion is essential for the believer. Jesus' words are clear, "Where two or three are gathered in my Name, I am in the mist of them." The word communion comes from the word "community". Human beings were created to be in community. From the beginning, God stated that it was not good for man to be alone. So God created Eve so that Adam would not be alone.

It is not good for us to be alone. We need to come together. COVID, like the flu, is going be here. Its not going to be eradicated. As of now, we are living with the "Delta" variant. It is estimated that "Delta" will be in the upper Midwest by Fall or Winter 2021. The vaccines are out. Most of the "high risk" groups have been vaccinated. It's time to move out from our hovels and gather as a community around God's altar. The Psalmist cries: "Where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, Creator of heaven and earth." God's help comes to those who gather at Trinity. God's help comes from where God's word is preached and the sacraments are distributed as our Lord and Savior commands. Lay aside your differences, it's time to come and worship our resurrected Lord and Savior. It is far better for us to rely on the Lord, then to rely on the politicians and bureaucrats. They are limited and seriously flawed. Moreover, God does it all. He will protect and guide you on your way. If you wear a mask, come! If you do not wear a mask, don't judge one who does not. If you are antimask, don't judge one who wears a mask. God is God of all! God gives us those in the medical profession to heal us. They also can take us only so far! The true healing of both body and soul occurs when we gather around God's altar at Trinity. We can do this!

God will not hinder us from coming before Him as one community under the banner of the cross. God is with us wherever we go! He will not abandon us in this place. Come let us worship our risen Lord and Savior! Trust him! He will lead us through the shadows of Death!

Jesus rose for you! He conquered death for you! COVID will not separate you from the love of God found in Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior.
