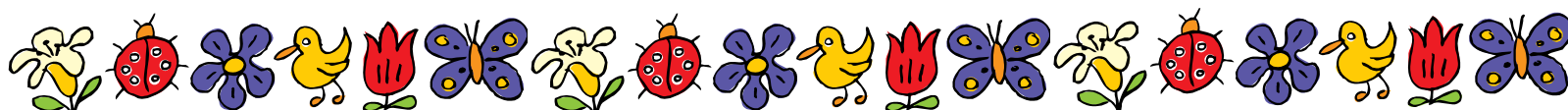

This year, the event was hosted at Lambeau Field featuring UW System President and former Gov. Tommy Thompson as the keynote speaker with hundreds in attendance.

Elders corner for March 2022

March is a very important month in our Christian and Spiritual lives in the church.

As Advent was to Christmas, Lent is to Easter. We need to prepare our bodies and souls for Jesus to die and remove all of our sins. Lenten season starts with Ash Wednesday which is the day of reflection and repentance from sin. Lent is the period that Jesus went into the desert too fast for forty days and being tempted by Satan.

Throughout Lent, most Christians adopt a period of fasting, repentance, prudence, and spiritual development. In the earlier years Christians use to fast the 40 days before Easter. In the later years it came a common practice to give something up, like smoking, watching TV, social media, or a food or drink, such as sweets, chocolate or coffee but none of this compares to what Jesus gave up removing all of our sins. The goal is not to focus on your own sacrifice of giving something up but recognizing that Jesus' sacrifice for mankind.

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." ~ John 3:16-17

To God be the glory!

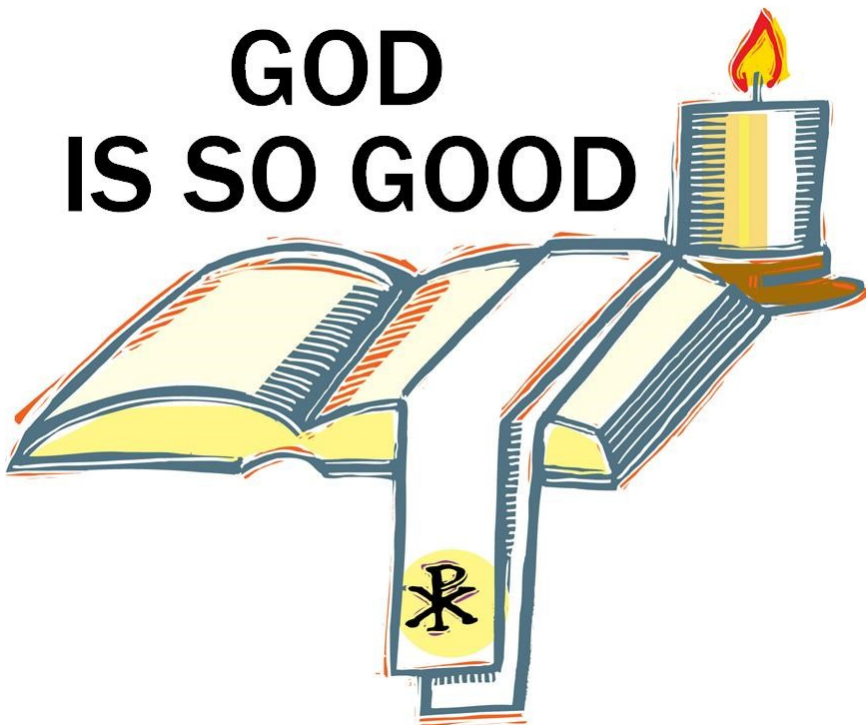
