**Learn Ya Good!** 

September is right around the corner. September means lots of things are starting. Confirmation, committee meetings, Men's Club, and most importantly, Sunday School.

Sunday School is a relatively new invention. Luther didn't do it, nor did the old Fathers from the early days. Non Lutheran Americans came up with this, and we stole it (we do that sometimes). The principle is simple: In addition to hearing the Word of God read and preached, we study the Word of God and talk about what it says as a group so that we might better understand it. We do it as a group so we can swap stories, ideas, things we've heard, etc.

For children, this is a simple introduction to the stories of the Bible, getting them used to hearing who Abraham was, what Moses did, David and Goliath, that kind of thing. It usefully sets the stage for Confirmation, where the students learn what all of these stories tell us and what we're supposed to learn from them.

For adults, this is our time to strengthen our bonds between each other and explore both the history of the church (I'm good at that part) and what a particular book means (depending on the book, I'm sometimes good at that part. Just don't ask me about Zechariah). The Bible is a book written two thousand plus years ago to people in a very different culture and mindset. It can be tricky to understand what we 21st century Americans are to learn from it for that reason.

We know the basics. The Bible is the Word of God, all of it, every single syllable. We know that the Bible is there to teach us that we are sinners, and that God works to save each and every generation from their sins. The entire Bible is about Jesus and what He will eventually do (or did do, in the case of the New Testament).

Find the whole thing confusing? Come to Sunday School. We'll clear some of that up. The Bible leaves us with plenty of mysteries, but one thing is clear: It is the Word of God, and it is there to teach us and guide us just as much as it did Luther, Walther, St. John, Moses, and all the saints throughout the ages.

Faith is a matter of the heart, the soul, rather than the intellect or brain. A child's faith is deeply simple and unintellectual, yet that faith is held up as an example for us. An infant knows his mother, her voice, her smell, and her touch. The infant can explain none of this, but none doubt that baby knows mom. Blessed is the mind too small for doubt.

Despite these truths, God commands us to train our minds as well as our hearts. Paul says this in Ephesians 4: "And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers,12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes."
