Gratitude Is the Mark of the Christian



My father was a busy man when I grew up, but he was around. He never missed the family things he needed to go to. In particular, I remember a catchphrase that pertains to our season today. Whenever I would complain about something, my father would respond with this: "Noah, gratitude is the mark of the Christian." No matter where he (or I) was in the house, he would say this. Sometimes, he would yell it, if he was in the basement workshop and I was upstairs. Whenever I complained, all I would hear is this. Sometimes I would hear his voice drifting up from the floorboards, through the heating vents, like he somehow could read my mind and knew I was grumbling. "Gratitude is the mark of the Christian!"

Luther agrees. One of the most striking things that Luther said (and that is saying something, Luther famously had a very large mouth that he ran all the time) is that Christianity in Germany would die. He said this was inevitable. One day, there would be few (if any) Christians in Germany. Why? Unthankfulness was his answer.

Not secularism. Not sin. Not gossip. Not debauchery or ignoring the Word of God or any of the things that we lament today. Unthankfulness. Not being thankful would be the downfall of Christian faith in Germany. Today there are few Christians in Germany, it is hard to say that Luther was wrong. But the reason always struck me. *Unthankfulness*. That was enough to erode and corrode the Christian faith of the people.

Unthankfulness is easy. Gratitude is hard. Focusing on what we have, rather than what we don't have, is natural to us sinners. We want what we cannot have, we don't want what we have. Lord, have mercy on us. Thankfully (har har) we have a great deal to give thanks to God for. It's all there, it just takes some work to notice it.

So notice it. Take your days this month of November to remember the things you still have, great and small. When you're tempted to gripe, make a list of what you have instead of what you don't. Make a list of what's going right instead of what's going wrong. Then pray (or recite) psalm 131 to yourself. Lord, let my eyes focus on what is in front. On what is there. Let me see the gifts You give. God trains your eyes to be grateful and your heart to be big. He trains your mind to do rather than complain. We all wish things were different. God teaches us to value what He gives, and He loves to teach this lesson again and again.
