

Hear, See, Feel

I had to see the lake.

As I was getting settled in here at Trinity over the summer, trying to get the house in order and starting to go out and meet you all, I was enjoying myself a great deal. But, there was still something left to do. I had to see the lake. Lake Michigan. There's nothing like it in the American West, that vast expanse stretching to the horizon and beyond. So I went, I stood on the shore, and felt something I'd not felt in ages. It wasn't because of what I was seeing, though.

God has woven incredible beauty in nature, but you can **see** that beauty in pictures. **Seeing** is not enough, you have to be there, to stand at the place yourself. Then, the true majesty of what God has made comes into proper focus. Pictures cannot capture the colors of the lake; they're warmer, richer in person. They cannot capture the smells, iron, exhaust, rotting seaweed. The sounds, the gentle rolling of waves on surf, the cries of the gulls, the distant shouts of playing children. Pictures, most importantly, cannot capture the **scale** and presence of what you are looking at. How small you are. How enormous the lake is. How ancient and timeless, water beating sand against the shore for thousands of years or more. Our open and primal spaces are God's canvas, and He has given us an art gallery beyond all comparison.

If all that is so, I ask you, why then do we often say that **seeing is believing?** It's not seeing that gives nature its touch. We could look at pictures all day, and we are **seeing it,** but seeing isn't enough. You have to be there. So why do we think that if we see, that means it is true? We recognize that our national monuments and nature preserves and all that have to be fully experienced to be fully appreciated. Why do we think that seeing is believing?

The Bible tells us something different. The Bible tells us that hearing is believing. "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching?" Hearing is believing. We hear our faith told to us, explained to us, preached to us. We have not seen Christ with our eyes. We have heard Him with our ears, and that is good enough. Why? Hearing is believing.

That is hard to swallow, but why? Seeing pictures isn't enough, you have to be there, we recognize that. We think that hearing isn't trustworthy because there are so many lies out there. But God's Word is true, and God's Word gives us Jesus through our ears. It tells us what we need to hear and what we need to know. It is hard to listen because we live in such a noisy world, full of lies and distractions and ads. It's maddening. It's hard to hear a man talking and remember that God's Word is coming out of his mouth. It's hard to read a book and remember that this is what God wants for me.

In that book, in those words, you have God's presence, just like going out and seeing Lake Michigan or The Grand Canyon gives you the presence of those places. When you hear God preaching to you, even though He is using the voice of men, He is coming to you in His grace and mercy. I know that's hard to imagine. A sermon or devotional book just doesn't have the same punch, the same impact, you don't feel it in your gut like you do staring at a canyon or a lake up north. But your senses are lying to you. When God speaks, things happen. When He says, "I forgive you all your sins," He's there, doing it. When He says, "take, eat, this is my body" He's there, making it so, even if it looks like a machine-stamped wafer. When He says, "I am with you always, 'till the end of the age," well, that is how He does it. With words. Words that make that same intangible difference that standing at the lake does.




