#### **Fundamentals**

### Creeds, Lord's Prayer

Even our weirdest worship services (and we have a few of those, just poke around in your hymnal sometime) ask us to recite one of the Creeds and the Lord's Prayer. Every Sunday, every Wednesday, every time we get together, we say these things. Why? If you're like me, you can probably recite these in your sleep. It took me years to stop saying the "quick and the dead" when the new hymnal came out though.

Most of you probably know the tale of Vince Lombardi. I do not football, and *I* know the tale of Vince Lombardi. He sat down with the Packers and had them start from the beginning with those famous words: "This is a football." Far from being pedantic, there was a method to his madness as I understand it. He wanted them to go over the fundamentals of the game first. To re-tune themselves to the basics.

That is why we insist on reciting the Creeds, on saying the Lord's Prayer. We are keeping the fundamentals in mind. We are dribbling, tossing the football, kicking the soccer ball, insert whatever metaphor suits you. Without these basics, we don't get very far in our Christian faith. Without these basics, we forget our first love. We forget what it is all about.

The Creeds remind us what our church is all about. Each is a series of sentences about something important in the Christian faith. If you're like me, you've long since figured that you knew this stuff. Why do we need to recite it *every time?* Because it is that important, it our fundamentals. The basketball player dribbles, the football player throws the football, we confess. The church's trade is ideas that we present with love and care. You want to polish that, you want to sharpen those ideas, jam them in as deep as you can and say them in as many ways as you can. To do that, you need to understand them. To do that, we recite them and think about them.

It's the same for the Lord's Prayer. The Lord's Prayer is our default weapon; it is the old faithful that we reach out for in all kinds of different situations. God wants you to pray and gives you the freedom to pray pretty much however you like. But God also knows that words aren't everybody's strong suit, so God gives us the words we need. When in doubt? Pray the Lord's Prayer. In trouble? Pray the Lord's Prayer. Everything going smoothly? Pray the Lord's Prayer. While you pray, think about what it means. If it seems like the same old-same old, then keep trying, God will reveal something interesting about it.

There was a church that John wrote to in Revelation that forgot their fundamentals, the church in Ephesus. God tells them this: "4 But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. 5 Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first."

There you have it. Gentlemen, this a Christianity. The Creeds, and the ideas they teach us. The Lord's Prayer, and what it teaches us to say. Don't forget your fundamentals. They will see you to the grave, and beyond.
