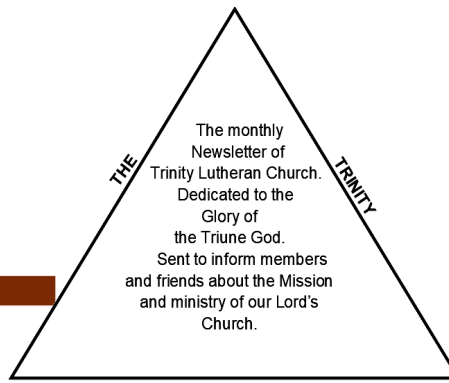

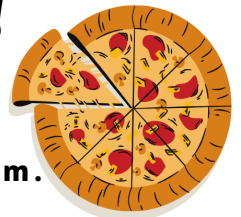

God likes to put reminders around us about His work and His promises. The rainbow is one of the most prominent, but the rainbow isn't a church ritual. It isn't like Baptism or Confirmation or Communion. The rainbow is just *there*, a naturally occurring thing that God has assigned meaning to. It's easy to forget that the rainbow is one of the oldest promises God makes. It is a promise not just to man, but to the whole earth.

Here's how He explains it in Genesis: **“¹²And God said, “This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: ¹³I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. ¹⁴When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, ¹⁵I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh. And the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. ¹⁶When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.”**

Never again will the waters destroy. That is, never again will the waters destroy *wholesale*. There will be floods, but they will not be Earth-destroying ones. I've always found this promise bizarrely specific, to the point of being a little off-putting. It's like someone promising that they'll never, ever murder you with a knife. That's nice to hear, but you'd really rather hear the person promise not to murder you at all, rather than being so pointed (pun intended) about it.

I still think that way, but I find myself fixated on the rainbow these days. Rather, I find myself fixated on what the rainbow means and doesn't mean, and what it says about God. The rainbow reminds us that God cares about and loves His creation, and that He will not let His creation be destroyed by the waters. This is helpful, but there are numerous other ways that creation could be destroyed. If not destroyed, then scarred. Broken. Dysfunctional. Like us. God doesn't promise to stop that, not entirely. He promises that so long as the rainbow stands, He will remember.

He does the same thing with Jesus. God needs no reminders, but despite that, God often makes reminders for Himself. Jesus is another. Whenever our sins tempt God's wrath, God looks at Jesus, and remembers that our sins have been forgiven. He is reminded of what His Son did, and how His wrath was satisfied by Jesus' blood.

The rainbow means many things to many people. Remember that God put it there first, and He meant it as a sign of His promise and His love. It is a symbol of divine mercy. Remember Jesus, the one who did divine mercy so well it changed our entire species. Next time you see a rainbow-either on a flag, or a banner, or (let's hope!) a real one... have yourself a smile, and remember Your God is watching over your world with mercy.

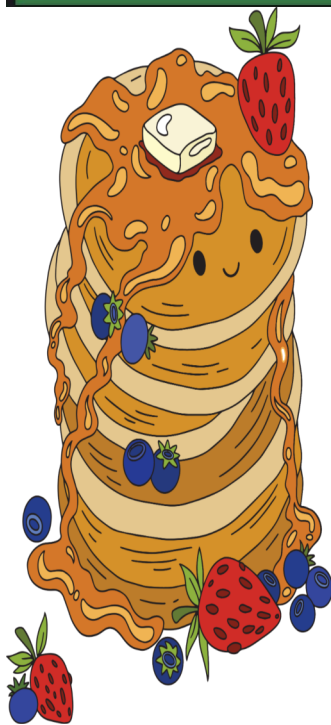

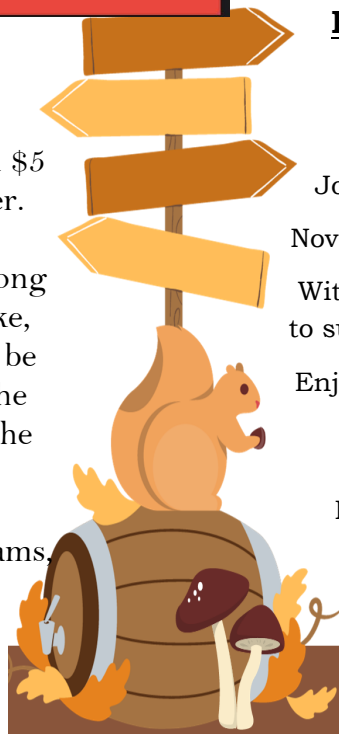
