Piles of Rock

Just after the Israelites crossed over the Jordan to conquer the Canaanites, God commanded them to pile up rocks. River rocks. Joshua 4:4-7: "Then Joshua called the twelve men from the people of Israel, whom he had appointed, a man from each tribe. ⁵And Joshua said to them, "Pass on before the ark of the LORD your God into the midst of the Jordan, and take up each of you a stone upon his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the people of Israel, ⁶that this may be a sign among you. When your children ask in time to come, 'What do those stones mean to you?' ⁷then you shall tell them that the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD. When it passed over the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. So these stones shall be to the people of Israel a memorial forever."

The rocks had a point. They were to be a monument, a reminder, a spur to tell a story to children. In Joshua's time, the crossing of the Jordan was to make it very clear to the Israelites that God was with them, that God was with *Joshua*, just like God was with Moses. In later times, they would give Israelites something to use to tell their children the story.

We still pile rocks. We build. We weave. We sing. We carve. God has given our hands the gift of craft, of beauty. We create symbols to beautify our church, we carve them and fix them with reminders. The cross as a reminder of Jesus' suffering for us. The altar as a reminder of sacrifice. The stained glass contains pictures and scenes from the Bible, teaching our eyes. We write the names of Gospel writers and saints into our churches. We fill our buildings with songs about God and His work. I have stood in many churches. I have read their constitutions, I have seen their cornerstones, I have read dedications. All of them say some variation of "we do this for the glory of God." And they do.

But why? What does God care for buildings made of stone, or carved wood, or colored glass? He is the Creator of the universe, He owns all. Well, Joshua reminds us of what God's glory is. God glories in keeping promises and reminding people about those promises. God glories in us remembering what He has done for us. Everything you see in church is a reminder, a touchstone, a thing to help you remember what all this is about: Jesus saving us from our sins.

That is why these things please Him. That is why your artwork, your industry, your dedication, your banners, and glass, and songs, and prayers, and everything else pleases Him. You do it to show His promises. It doesn't have to be fancy. For the Israelites, it was rocks, undressed, straight from the river Jordan. That's all it took to make God smile, because He commanded the Israelites to commemorate, to remember, and to tell the story.

Look around your church. See something you haven't seen before. If you've seen it all, try to see it with fresh eyes. If you're stuck at home, look at your religious art. Your little family cross, or your paintings. If you don't have any of those, look at your Bible. Remember that all of this teaches something, all of it means something, and that we build it to remember Jesus and God's enduring promises.

Not bad for piles of rock.


